Greetings from National Solar Energy Federation of India.

The outbreak of Corona Virus (COVID-19) throughout the globe was declared as a global emergency by the World Health Organization (WHO) in Feb'20. In this regard, Government of India (GoI) had imposed a complete nationwide lockdown since 22.03.2020 and the same still continues partially, as the situation is actually worsening day by day. Some of the states had already started to restrict activities prior to 22nd March 2020, on account of COVID spread.

Since the imposition of lockdown, development of various under construction projects are still in a standstill situation. The COVID-19 outbreak was first reported in China, and thereafter it spread across the globe. While the full lockdown imposed by the Gol is being lifted in phased manners, the ground situation is that the work could not happen during lockdown, and the labours actually started returning to their natives when lockdown started to phase out. As a result, the project activities continue to remain severely hampered due to imposition of lockdown.

Despite unlock-1 phase being initiated with restoration of few services (till 30th June 2020) and subsequent, unlock-2 guidelines relaxing certain additional services, restrictions still continue like suspension of railways, imposition of night curfews, restriction on social gathering etc. Further, many cities & states continue to have stringent lockdown like situation in place. Such impositions have further impacted the project development activities in addition to the labours being unable to commute back to their workplaces till date.

Further, international travel continues to remain prohibited till date, which has impacted the procurement process of imported items like modules & inverters, resulting in total halt in the procurement process.

Considering the above situation, MNRE had provided blanket extension to all under construction projects for a period of Lockdown period + 30 days. Recently, vide MNRE OM dated 30.06.2020, it has been clarified that the lockdown period is considered from 25th March till 31st May 2020.

With due respect, we would like to state that due to labour exodus in the country to their natives during and immediately after the Lockdown period, rapid increase in COVID 19 cases across the country, continuation of curfew & containment zones in many cities and transport restrictions for domestic and international travel have resulted in halting of the land procurement, construction and procurement activities .

Further, while a noble step has been taken by the Gol announcing free ration to the poor throughout the country till November, 2020, this may also result in extended stay by labour in their native places.

The GOI is fully aware of these challenges, and to address the labour exodus challenges, Hon'ble Finance Minister, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman had declared extension of six (06) months to all Public Private Partnership contracts.
