1. INTRODUCTION

The National Institute of Solar Energy (NISE), an autonomous institution of the Ministry of New and Renewable (MNRE), is the apex National R&D institution in the field of Solar Energy. The Government of India has converted the 25-year-old Solar Energy Centre (SEC) under MNRE to an autonomous institution on 23rd September 2013 to assist the Ministry in implementing the National Solar Mission and to pursue research, technology development, and other related works in the field of solar energy. The institute is involved in demonstration, standardization, interactive analysis, training, and testing of solar technologies and systems. It is an interface between the Government and academic institutions, industry & user organizations for the development, promotion, and widespread utilization of solar energy in the country.

2. INVITATION FOR TENDER

On behalf of the Director-General, National Institute of Solar Energy, Gurugram, technical and financial bids are invited from the technically capable vendors for **“Supply, Installation & Commissioning of test set up for Continuity test of equipotential bonding of PV module as per MST 13 of IEC 61730-2: 2016 at National Institute of Solar Energy, Gurugram, Haryana.”**

3. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

This part provides brief overview of the main tendering related provisions of various policies of the Govt. of India (those related to MSEs, Make in India, Start Up India, DPIIT guidelines etc. Bidders are encouraged in their own interest to go through the original policy documents issued by concerned ministries / departments as these are revised from time to time. For the purpose of tender evaluation and deciding eligibility / ineligibility of bidder's offer, interpretation will be based on the current provisions in the original document of the concerned policy.

3.1 Eligibility of Bidders

- A. Bidders must have sales tax and income tax registration. Copy of PAN Card and GST/ Sales Tax Registration should accompany the quotation. Bidder must have the required facilities/expertise to supply, installation of the necessary items for which the bid is submitted.

B. It is the policy of the Government of India to encourage 'Make in India' and promote manufacturing and production of goods and services in India with a view to enhancing income and employment, therefore, in this tender preference will be given to local supplier to promote 'make in India'.

C. Bidders must comply with Make in India Order No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 16th September 2020 of Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India (GoI) and any amendments thereon.

D. Only 'Class I local supplier' and 'Class-II local supplier' as defined under the DPIIT Order No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 16th September 2020 are eligible to bid in this tender.

Local Content means the amount of value added in India which shall unless otherwise prescribed by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE), GoI, be the total value of the item procured (excluding net domestic indirect taxes) minus the value of imported content in the item (including all customs duties) as a proportion of the total value, in percent.

'Class-I Local Supplier' means a supplier or service provider, whose goods, services or works offered for procurement, has local content equal to or more than 50%, as defined in DPIIT Order No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 16th September 2020.

'Class-II Local Supplier' means a supplier or service provider, whose goods, services or works offered for procurement, has local content more than 20% but less than 50%, as defined in DPIIT Order No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 16th September 2020.

The 'Class-I Local Supplier'/'Class-II Local Supplier' at the time of tender, bidding or solicitation shall be required to indicate percentage of local content and provide self-certification that the item offered meets the local content requirement for 'Class-I Local Supplier'/'Class-II Local Supplier', as the case may be. They shall also give details of the location(s) at which the local value addition is made.

E. Any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Competent Authority (Registration Committee as constituted by Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade) and should submit a valid registration Certificate. (Please refer to Order no.6/18/2019-PPD dated 23 July 2020 and any amendments thereon).

"Bidder" (including the term 'tenderer', 'consultant' or 'service provider' in certain contexts) means any person or firm or company, including any member of a consortium or joint venture (that is an association of several persons, or firms or companies), every artificial judicial person not falling in any of the descriptions of bidder stated hereinbefore, including any agency branch or Officer controlled by such person, participating in a procurement process.

"Bidder from a country which shares a land border with India" for the purpose of this order means:

- I. An entity incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
- II. A subsidiary of an entity incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
- III. An entity substantially controlled through entities incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
- IV. An entity whose beneficial owner is situated in such a country; or
- V. An Indian (or other) agent of such an entity; or
- VI. A natural person who is a citizen of such a country; or
- VII. A consortium or joint venture where any member of the consortium or joint venture falls under any of the above
- VIII. The beneficial owner for the purpose of above will be as under
 - a. In case of a company or Limited Liability Partnership, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s), who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more judicial person, has a controlling ownership interest or who exercise control through other means.

Explanation -

- a) "Controlling ownership interest" means ownership of a or entitlement to more than twenty-five percent of shares or capital or profits of the company.

Self-certification should be submitted as per the Order no.6/18/2019-PPD dated 23 July 2020. A model certificate format is attached in Annexure 7.

3.2. General Guidelines for the bidder:

1. The bidder shall have to be an entity registered in India in accordance with law.
2. The bids shall be in the language as prescribed by the tenderer/procurer.
3. The bids shall be in Indian National Rupees (INR) only in respect of local content only.
4. Indian subsidiaries of foreign bidders shall meet the qualifying criteria in terms of capability, competency, financial position, past performance etc.
5. The bidder shall follow Indian laws, regulations and standards.
6. Country of origin of the equipment/material shall be provided in the bid.
7. For supply of equipment / material from the country of origin other than India, the bidder shall submit performance certificate in support of satisfactory operation in India or a country other than the country of origin having climatic and operational conditions including ambient temperature similar to that of India for more than 1 years.
8. The technologies, products offered shall be environmentally friendly, consuming less energy, and safe, energy efficient, durable and long lasting under the prescribed operational conditions.
9. The supplier shall ensure supply of spares, materials and technological support for the entire life of the project.
10. Domestic Content requirement (based on the cost of the product) shall be in accordance with the conditions laid down in respective Order(s) of the sectors on Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) to provide for purchase preference (linked with local content).
11. The equipment material sourced from foreign companies may be tested in NABL accredited labs in India before acceptance wherever such facilities are available.
12. The Tender fee and the Bank Guarantee (BG) shall be in Indian Rupees only.
13. Applicable safety requirements shall be met.
14. Statutory laws/regulations including the labour and environmental laws shall be strictly complied with during supply, storage, erection, commissioning and operation process.
15. Tendering by the agent shall not be accepted.
16. Certification/compliance as per the Indian Standards/ International Standards, Indian
17. Regulations specified Standards shall be mandatory, where ever applicable.
18. Wherever required, the foreign supplier shall establish fully functional service centers in India and shall keep spares/material locally for future needs of utilities.
19. Arbitration proceedings shall be instituted in India only and all disputes shall be settled as per applicable Indian Laws.

3.2 Performance and Warranty

- a. The bidder will assume total responsibility for fault-free operation and performance as needed for Continuity Tester as per IEC 61730-2:2016 MST – 04. The technical details are mentioned on the specification sheet.
- b. Bidder will assume full responsibility for its maintenance during the warranty period and provide necessary services as and when required, free of charge.
- c. The warranty must be valid for two years from the date of commissioning of the equipment.

3.3 Disqualification

- a. The Bidders/Vendors will be subject to disqualification if they do not meet the criteria given above or if they have made an untrue or false representation in the forms, statements, and attachments submitted in proof of the qualification requirements or have a record of poor performance of not

properly completing the contract, causing inordinate delays in completion or having financial failures etc.

- b. Vendors should submit the client lists for similar supplied systems; accordingly, NISE may take feedback from the client. In case of unsatisfactory feedback, NISE reserves the right to disqualify the vendor.

Note: Mere submission of bid does not suffice for the order to be placed on the bidder; all bids will be subjected to a strict scrutiny process for evaluation by the technical evaluation committee.

The purpose of this test is to verify the continuous path between accessible conductive parts that are in direct contact with each other (e.g., parts of a metallic frame).

5. General Conditions of Contract

Inspections and Tests: All acceptance tests as per relevant specification shall be carried out by the bidder/ vendor at its works prior to dispatch of the set up to the NISE premises. During such tests, NISE reserves the right to depute its representatives to vendor's works.

Delivery: The system should be delivered to PVTF lab of NISE within 12 weeks from the acceptance date of PO.

Warranty: The bidder/ vendor shall provide a warranty as mentioned in the technical specifications after completion of commissioning.

Payment:

100% payment will be released after testing, commissioning, and acceptance of the system /equipment to the entire satisfaction of the Purchaser and on the production of performance bank guarantee of the amount of 3% of the Contract Value, which will be retained for a period of warranty.

Performance Guarantee: The successful bidder should deposit 3% of contract value in the form of Demand Draft / FDR / Bank Guarantee from a commercial bank in India should be provided as performance Guarantee valid for 60 days beyond the warranty period. The warranty period will start from the date of acceptance of system by NISE.

Taxes and Duties: The bidder/ vendor shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, custom duties, license fees, road permits, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted Goods to NISE. In case these are claimed, these have to be mentioned separately in the quotation.

Penalty Clause: For any delay beyond the period specified in the Contract, NISE shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the Contract, deduct from the Contract Price, a penalty amounting to half percent of the contract price per week of delay subject to a ceiling of 5% of the contract price.

Applicable Law: The Contract shall be interpreted in accordance to the laws of the Union of India and all disputes shall be subject to the place of jurisdiction in Gurugram, Haryana.

Purchase Preference:

- i. Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is 'Class I local supplier', the contract will be awarded to L1.
- ii. If L1 is not 'Class I local supplier', the lowest bidder among the 'Class I local supplier', will be invited to match the L1 price subject to Class I local supplier's quoted price falling within the margin of 'purchase preference', and the contract shall be awarded to such 'Class I local supplier' subject to matching the L1 price.
- iii. In case such lowest eligible 'Class I local supplier' fails to match the L1 price, the 'Class I local supplier' with the next higher bid within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price and so on and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case none of the 'Class I local supplier' within the margin of purchase preference matches the L1 price, the contract may be awarded to the L1 bidder.
- iv. **Margin of purchase preference:** the margin of purchase preference shall be 20%.

For the purpose of purchase preference, Make in India Order No. no. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 16th September 2020 of Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India (GoI) and any amendments thereon will be followed.

Rejection Terms: Incomplete/ conditional/ fax/ late quotation will be rejected summarily. Director General, National Institute of Solar Energy reserves the right to reject any or all the quotations at his discretion without assigning any reason thereafter.

- (vii) Submission of Bidder/ Vendor Data (Annexure 6).
- (viii) Self-certification stating the class of local supplier should be provided as per Make in India Order No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 16th September 2020 of Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India (GoI).
- (ix) Self-certification should be submitted as per the Order no.6/18/2019-PPD dated 23 July 2020. Format attached in Annexure – 7.
- (x) Technical bid should be submitted as per the technical specifications of this tender.
- (xi) Signed copy of the tender document.
- (xii) Bid security declaration.
