At the outset, the representative of the Petitioner submitted that the present Petitions have been filed seeking (i) adoption of transmission charges in respect of the "Transmission System for Evacuation of Power from REZ In Rajasthan (20 GW) Under Phase-III Part I" (the Project), as discovered through the tariff-based competitive bidding process, and (ii) grant of a transmission licence for establishment of the said Project. He further submitted that the Petitioner has already complied with the directions issued vide Record of Proceedings dated 13.3.2025, and the CTUIL has also furnished its recommendations under Section 15(4) of the Electricity Act, 2003 in favour of the grant of the transmission licence to the Petitioner.
