







## Storage Is No Longer Optional

Maharashtra is the first Indian state to explicitly treat energy storage as a **central enabler** of RE integration — not an add-on. The policy combines affordability, energy security, competition, and consumer choice into a single integrated growth framework, superseding the 2020 RE Policy for all new grid-connected projects.

# The Numbers That Define the Decade

## 50%

**RE Share by FY30**

Rising to 65% by FY 2035-36

**Storage Obligation**

DISCOMs must procure by FY 2035-36

## 100GW

**RE Capacity Target**

Implied equivalent by FY 2035-36

## 100GWh

**Storage Implication**

Per day (~20 GW at 5-hr duration)

The renewable charging condition is equally stringent: storage obligations are deemed met only if **at least 85% of stored energy** annually is charged from renewable sources.
